Useful Information

School Time

The Nursery school hours are from 7.35 to 12:00 pm. The side gate next to the Early Years Department will be open from 11:55pm to 12:10 for collection. Children with siblings at PHES are allowed to wait in their classroom until the end of the school day and will have a second snack and resting time until collection at 13:50.

Please drop off your child at the outside doors of the Early Years building punctually. Should you arrive early, please do not leave your child unattended within the school grounds. Children are to be collected from the outside door of their respective classrooms.

The gates are open from 6:45 am for a staggered drop off and school will finish at 1:50 pm. If collecting a child/ren in EYFS/KS1 and KS2 you must collect the younger child and walk round the building to the main entrance to go and collect the KS2 child.

School Uniform

School uniform is compulsory. Nursery children do not need any school bag, only a lunch bag to carry their lunch box in. As our cubbies are too small for bags, no bags will be allowed. Please make sure that all your child's clothing and belongings are clearly marked with your child's name. You can refer to the school website www.parkhouseschool.com for uniform details.

Lunch Box

Your child will need a small lunch box containing a healthy snack e.g. cut up fruit, vegetables, a sandwich / pasta, a fruit juice (box with straw) as well as a water bottle. Please do not send treats like chocolate, candy, cake, crisps, or biscuits. Only send yoghurts if your child can eat independently without spilling too much.

Illness

Please inform the school office if your child is ill. Sick children should remain at home for the well-being of the child and to prevent the spread of germs. Medication can be administered at school, by the school nurse, if a parent has provided approval in letter form.

Transition

Our aim is to ensure that the children experience a smooth transition from the small Nursery setting to PHES, following the EYFS curriculum. Learning through play will continue to be an important part of the school day, but we will also offer some structured lessons, where the children will work in small focus groups or as a class on Literacy and Mathematics activities, to prepare them for Reception.

Lesson delivery

Registration will take place in school on face-to-face days and submission of work on online days will be taken as registration.

Online learning

The teachers will provide tasks and activities online through a variety of methods including instructional videos. A link to the learning will be sent via email. MUSIC will be sent via Dojo. Submission of work will be through Evidence Me.

Evidence Me

We will be using Evidence Me for parents to submit set work during online learning days by uploading observations, pictures and videos of your child's learning, simply add these to the app or web suite. The 'Parent Share' feature in Evidence Me also enables you to view reports (complete with photos) via the app, showing you what your child has been learning and the new skills they are developing in

school. You will receive an email in the next few days from support@2eskimos.com asking you to confirm that you would like to participate. Make sure you check your spam/junk inbox as sometimes emails can get lost in there. Please do download the app and accept the invitation to be able to send and receive observations of their child's learning. Children only attending ONLINE

There will be work also set for children who are not attending any face to face sessions.

Completing work and marking

The children are expected to follow normal school day timings when online as much as they can. We are aware that sometimes this may not work with working parents and time zones so we are setting timings that work. Submission is expected by midnight on the 3rd day. All feedback will be fully completed for those 3 days by midnight the next day.
